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Introduction

It is important for all community members to be informed, prepared, and ready to respond to an emergency. Emergencies can be caused by a natural, accidental or intentional event and may occur at any time, any place, and without any warning. By developing an emergency plan ahead of time you can help protect the safety and well-being of yourself, your family, and your community.

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Preparing for an Emergency

What Is a Family Emergency Plan?



A family emergency preparedness plan is a written guide to prepare family members for disasters in order to secure the safety of your family. The plan should meet your family's needs for three (3) days and all family members should know how and when to use the plan.

How to Develop a Family Emergency Plan

- 1. Discuss any type of natural or man-made disaster that could affect your family.**
- 2. Determine escape routes from your home.**
 - Draw a floor plan of your home. Mark two escape routes from each room.
- 3. Talk with employers and school officials about their emergency response plans.**
 - Contact your child's school to obtain information about the school's emergency response plan.
 - If children are at school, they will be sheltered there.
 - Parents should not try to get to the school to bring their children home, unless instructed to do so.
- 4. Establish emergency phone numbers.**
 - 911 (teach children how and when to use)
 - Out of area family contact
 - Schools
 - Work
 - Neighbors
 - Emergency Management
 - Police
 - Fire
 - Poison Control
- 5. Establish a single point contact.**
 - Single point contact is a person (family member or friend who is outside of your area) whom family members should call and check in with to see if everyone is safe and/or for updated information.
 - Have two ways of contact; such as e-mail, phone, fax, etc.
 - Make sure all family members know the contact person's name, address, and phone number(s) and/or internet e-mail address and keep this information with them.
- 6. Establish places to meet.**
 - Plan how household members would stay in contact if separated.
 - Identify two meeting places (rally points): The first should be near your home, the second should be away from your neighborhood in the event you are unable to return home.
- 7. Include special needs items for family members such as:**
 - Infants
 - Older Adults
 - Persons with Disabilities
- 8. Include pet needs.**
- 9. Prepare an emergency supply kit. (Include a written copy of your plan in your kit)**
- 10. Practice your emergency plan and update as needed.**

Emergency Supply Kit

Food and Water



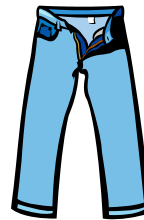
- Store at least a three day supply of water per household member. Allow one gallon of water per household member per day for consumption, cooking, and sanitation, stored in sanitized plastic containers. Seal water containers tightly and store in a cool, dark place.
- Store at least a three day supply of non-perishable foods per household member.
- Choose foods that require no refrigeration, preparation, or cooking, and little or no water if possible. Examples: peanut butter, jelly, crackers, trail mix, granola bars, canned tuna/meats, fruits and vegetables, powdered milk, instant coffee, tea. (Be sure to rotate food and water based on expiration dates)



Clothing and Bedding



- One complete change of clothing (One long sleeve shirt and one pair long pants) and footwear for each household member
 - Shoes should be sturdy (Work shoes or boots)
 - Rain gear, coats, hats, and gloves
 - Extra socks, underwear, thermal under garments
 - Pillow, blanket or a sleeping bag for each household member



Recommended Supplies

- ABC type Fire extinguisher
- Aluminum foil
- Battery powered radio
- Cash, credit card, travelers checks
- Can opener (non-electric)
- Compass
- Duct tape
- Dust mask
- Extra batteries
- Extra set of car keys
- Feminine supplies
- Flashlight
- Hard-wired telephone
- Household bleach
- Household documents (stored in a waterproof container)
- Hygiene items (toothbrush & toothpaste, waterless soap)



- Identification
- Kitchen items (paper cups, plates, plastic utensils, paper towels)
- Local map
- Matches and/or lighter
- Multi-purpose knife
- Paper, pen and/or pencil
- Plastic garbage bags & ties
- Plastic sheeting
- Sanitation items (toilet paper, plastic bucket with lid, disinfectant)
- Scissors
- Small insulated cooler (for medications, etc.)
- Small shovel
- Tools for shutting off utilities (pliers, wrench, screw driver)
- Towels
- Whistle
- Work gloves

First Aid Kit



- Tweezers
- Scissors
- Thermometer
- Antibiotic cream
- Latex gloves
- Cleansing agent/soap
- Instant cold packs (for medical purposes and keeping medication cold)
- Laxative
- Antacid
- Vitamins
- Prescription medication
- Non-prescription medication
- Antiseptic or Hydrogen Peroxide
- Anti-diarrhea medication
- Emetic (to induce vomiting)
- Aspirin or non-aspirin pain reliever
- Elastic non-adhesive bandage
- Gauze pads
- Sterile roll bandages
- Tongue depressor
- Hypoallergenic adhesive tape
- Butterfly bandages
- Sterile adhesive bandages (in assorted sizes)

Special Needs Suggested Items

- Baby medications

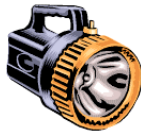
Supplementary Kits

Car Kit

The following items should be kept in your car in the event of an emergency, as you may have to shelter in your car.

Suggested items:

- Battery powered radio
- Booster cables
- Screwdriver
- Pliers
- Flares
- Flashlight
- Extra batteries
- Local maps
- Extra clothing
 - Long pants
 - Long sleeved shirt
 - Sturdy shoes/boots
- Sleeping bag and/or blanket
- First Aid Kit
- Bottled water
- Non-perishable foods (Store food in plastic containers, plastic bags, or coffee cans)
- Essential medications
- Paper and pen/pencil
- Waterless soap
- Disposable hand-wipes
- Paper towels
- Emergency Contact Card



Kid Kit

Have your children gather together a few items they enjoy and store them in a backpack or small suitcase.

Choose items that can be shared with all family members and other children.

Suggested items:

- Books
- Crayons
- Markers
- Puzzles
- Scissors
- Glue
- Paper and pens/pencils
- Coloring/Activity books
- Playing cards
- Stuffed animal
- Toy(s)
- Board games
- Surprise item
- Photos of family and pet
- Emergency Contact Card



Pet Preparedness

All family members, even your pets, should be prepared for any emergency event. Your emergency supply kit should include all of your pet's needs.



Since evacuation shelters generally do not accept pets, other than special needs animals, call in advance to animal shelters, hotels, motels, or a friend/relative outside of your area in order to check policies or to make arrangements for your pet's shelter.

If your pet is sheltered at home, confine your pet to one area, leave an adequate supply of food and water, and place a note on your front door to alert emergency personnel. The note should include owner's name, pet's name, type of pet, and location of pet.

For smaller pets, such as snakes, hamsters, ferrets, etc., be sure to place your name and contact information on cage.

Remember all dogs and cats must have a current rabies vaccination and be licensed in the town where the animal resides.

Pet Supplies for Emergencies

Recommended items:



- Medications
 - Medical records
 - Pet First Aid Book
 - Sturdy leash
 - Current photo of pet
 - Grooming items
 - Manual can opener
 - Food and water bowls
 - Plastic trash bags
 - Pet toys
 - Pet bed, pillow, and/or blanket
 - Name of Veterinarian
- Pet ID (make sure your pet is wearing current tags or other identifying information)
 - Pet carrier large enough to comfortably transport pet
 - Information on pet schedules (feeding, walking, medications etc.)
 - Information on your pet's behavior
 - Food and water for three days
 - Cat litter and litter box



Sheltering In Place (Shelter – Shut – Listen)



What is “Shelter in Place”?

“Shelter in place” means to seek immediate shelter and remain there during an emergency. Unless instructed to evacuate by emergency personnel, sheltering in a pre-determined safe location in your home or place of work is the preferred method of safely waiting out an emergency event.

How to “Shelter in Place”

- Bring your family and pets inside
- Lock doors, close windows, air vents and fireplace dampers
- Turn off fans, air conditioning and forced air heating systems
- Get your emergency supply kit and plan
- Have a battery powered radio with you
- Go to an interior room that’s above ground level (preferably a room that does not have windows or has the least number of windows) and close the door
 - 10 square feet of floor space per person to allow up to 5 hours of sufficient air
- Watch TV, listen to the radio or check the internet often for official news

How will people know if they need to “Shelter in Place”?

- Notification will be made by local police, emergency coordinators, or government through:
 - Radio or television
 - Website(s)
 - Loud speakers from police or fire trucks

Evacuation

- Wear long sleeved shirts, long pants, and sturdy shoes/boots
- Take your disaster supply kit and plan
- Take medications with you
- Account for all family members
- Take your pets with you
- Lock your home
- Use travel routes specified by authorities
- Stay away from downed power lines



Emergency Preparedness Tips

1. Keep car gas tank filled (gas pumps may not work if a power failure occurs)
2. Maintain car in good working condition
3. Have some cash (ATM machines may not work if a power failure occurs)
4. Have a smaller emergency supply kit in car
5. Teach family members how to use ABC fire extinguisher
6. Teach family members how to shut off utilities
 - Locate the electric, gas and water shut off valves
 - Keep necessary tools near gas and water shut off valves
 - Make available written directions on each utility
 - **If you turn the gas off, a professional must turn it back on. Do not attempt to do this yourself**
7. Have family members attend CPR/First Aid courses
8. Review insurance coverage, home and personal (photo inventory)
9. Every 6 months, check the expiration dates of your supplies
 - Replace any expired medications, food, or batteries
 - Replace water every 6 months
 - Replace clothing to appropriate size
10. Test all smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in home
11. Check all fire extinguishers annually
12. Place supplies in easy to carry containers, preferably waterproof, such as: plastic totes, equipment bags, large duffle bags, or luggage
13. Store emergency kit(s) off the floor, in a cool dry area, and away from overhead plumbing

Final Note

- Be aware of your surroundings
- Report suspicious activity
(call 9-1-1 as soon as possible)
- Remain calm
- Be prepared
- Be patient
- Follow instructions
- Think before you act
- Organize your plan
- Practice your plan
